July 14: Feast of Blessed Kateri Tekawitha: Kateri was born in New York, daughter of a Mohawk warrior. She was orphaned at four, suffered smallpox, adopted by two aunts and an uncle. She learned about the faith from the missionaries and was baptized at age 20. She had to leave her tribe for her safety. She moved to Canada and dedicated her life to prayer and care for the sick and aged. She died at the age of 24. She is known among native people as the **"Lily of the Mohawks"**
